Since graduating from Rouse Hill Anglican College, Jocelyn has continued to involve herself in significant service programs including [Red Frogs Australia](#), a support/chaplaincy program that provides relief from alcohol and drug related issues such as depression and anxiety in the youth of Australia.

In 2011, Jocelyn travelled to Vanuatu to assist in building a community and a church building in Tanna and to outreach to villages and families living in poverty.

Jocelyn's future plans include continued involvement with *Red Frogs Australia*, serving as a Team Leader at Schoolies 2013. She currently studies Nursing and also plans to travel to Nepal to undertake volunteer work in local hospitals.

Jocelyn has chosen *Red Frogs Australia* as the recipient of the donation of \$2000. Red Frogs is a support program for young people from the ages of 15 – 25. *Red Frogs* recognise that a growing culture of young people is dominated by alcohol and that excessive consumption of alcohol and other substances can lead to dangerous and life altering behaviours. Therefore *Red Frogs* make it their mission to provide a positive peer presence in alcohol-fuelled environments where young people gather, educate young people on safe partying behaviours, and promote and provide non-alcoholic and/or diversionary activities that engage young people in these environments.
